Revolutionary Blacks Discovering THE Frank Brothers, Freeborn Men of Color, Soldiers OF Independence Shirley L. Green

Dr. Shirley L. Green joins Washington Memorial Heritage on Thursday evening, October 24, at Washington Memorial Chapel to discuss *Revolutionary Blacks: Discovering the Frank Brothers, Freeborn Men of Color, Soldiers of Independence.* Dr. Green is Director of the Toledo Police Museum and an Adjunct Instructor of History at both the University of Toledo

and Bowling Green State University. She earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in History and Master of Arts degree in History from the University of Toledo and her Ph.D. in History from Bowling Green State University.

The program will take place in the Chapel's Bishop White Library (lower level; entrance around the back). Doors open at 6:00; the talk will begin at 6:30. Admission is \$10, with all proceeds supporting future Forum programs. Please join us!

Valley Forge Stories: William Rogers, Chaplain

William Rogers was born on a summer day in Newport, Rhode Island. An academically talented boy, at the age of only fourteen he entered the then named Rhode Island College (now Brown University). It is believed he enrolled prior to the first college president being installed and may have been the first and only student at the time. Following graduation in 1769, he was employed as a principal in a Newport academy, while completing a secondary degree in Divinity. In 1772 he became an ordained Baptist minister and



relocated to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania where he became pastor of the First Baptist Church.

With war looming on the horizon, the First Continental Congress met in Philadelphia in 1774. During that time, one of Rogers' parishioners began raising a militia, called the Pennsylvania Rifle Regiment. While not possible at the time to sign up, Rogers subsequently left his church at the end of 1775 and joined the regiment as their chaplain. Rogers would see action in Long Island and White Plains, New York, prior to involvement with the Pennsylvania State Battalion in New Jersey in late 1776 through 1777. Assigned to Patton's Additional Continental Regiment, he saw additional action at Brandywine and Germantown, prior to encamping at Valley Forge for the winter of 1777-1778.
